#### INCIDENT TITLE:

HARNESS CLIP

#### TIME AND DATE OF INCIDENT:

25/07/2014

#### **INCIDENT DETAIL:**

It was brought to the attention of the wind safety specialist on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> July 2014 that a waist strap clip on the Aspiring fall arrest harness had become disengaged while climbing over the main shaft.

Another Meridian employee on the same day discovered that his leg strap had become disengaged at some point and was left dangling freely.

In both reported events neither could be 100% sure if the clips were closed correctly in the beginning.

There was also another reported case at Te Apti 18<sup>th</sup> March 2014 of a leg strap dangling free.

This event was reviewed and investigated (Please see attached memo in Safety manager ID 249013)

The outcome of the investigation in short was the clip was not engaged correctly in the first place

### LEARNINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THIS INCIDENT:

- 1. It is compulsory to carry out Buddy checks every time you wear your harness.
- 2. A Triple check procedure must be followed.
  - Personal check to ensure correctly located
  - Your buddy to check
  - Personal check again
- 3. This will be monitored over the next few weeks and if we can eliminate human error an action plan will then be put into place.
- 4. It is important to report all incidents and near misses, so any further events like those already identified can be investigated to determine the root cause and then take the appropriate action.
